

A European degree

Graduates will obtain an internationally recognized double degree (MSc). Depending on the specialisation you choose, you receive:

- a MSc in Spatial Planning degree (60 ECs) or a MSc in Social and Political Sciences of the Environment degree (60 ECs) from Radboud University Nijmegen, and;
- a MSc degree in Spatial Planning (120 ECs) from Blekinge Tekniska Högskola or a MSc degree in European Spatial Planning and Environmental Policy (120 ECs) from Cardiff University.

Career prospects

There is great demand for spatial planners with a comprehensive knowledge of the European and international dimension of environmental policy and regional economic development. Our graduates can find employment in EU institutions, national and regional public authorities, private companies and NGOs dealing with spatial planning, regional policy and environmental planning. The international orientation and the extensive academic foundation of the Masters programme produces graduates well prepared to pursue a professional or academic career. The Professional Development module in semester 3 provides students with the opportunity to gain experience in professional practice. The PLANET Europe programme collaborates with a wide network of societal and academic partners.

Application and admission

Students with a Bachelor degree in a spatially-oriented discipline (such as spatial planning, human geography, or environmental planning) or other relevant social sciences qualify for admission. This is an English-language programme and proof of a high standard of proficiency in written and spoken English is required. Admission to the programme takes place once a year in September. Spatial planners now routinely cooperate with colleagues abroad. If you are interested in becoming a 'European spatial planner' who can effectively engage with the international policy context and in cross-cultural communication, PLANET Europe is the choice for you!

An innovative curriculum that prepares for practice and academia

PLANET Europe is a two-year full-time Masters programme (120ECs). Following a comprehensive introduction to the European dimension of spatial and environmental planning and the spatial impacts of EU policies, this unique Masters programme offers you the possibility to choose between the following tracks:

- European spatial planning and sustainable development (Nijmegen-Cardiff track).
- European spatial planning and regional economic development (Nijmegen-Karlskrona track).

In the third semester, you are on placement with a professional organisation where you can apply your knowledge to planning practice.

In the Intensive Seminar you reconvene with your fellow students to jointly work on a European spatial planning assignment. The Masters programme concludes with an individual Master thesis on a topic of choice under joint supervision from two of the universities.

Interactive teaching and learning

The three universities are known for their international environments where teaching is interactive and you can specialise in the area of your interest. This programme challenges and stimulates you with small group work on contemporary themes. You will learn to think critically about new developments in a comparative perspective. You receive personal supervision and thorough training in research methodologies for the social and political sciences.
